 - Arsenic removal- Mike Graham reported the project research is done, and the pipeline is completed to our property line. The NM environmental department deadline has past and Steve Crenshaw has given them our plan to join La Union system and when our plan is estimated to be completed. We have an engineering and cost estimate, then we have a year to complete it. The next deadline is to be in June 2010. The Arsenic committee is in the process of readying a financial plan for the homeowners.
